DEACON'S QUESTION BOX

If two people marry and have no children, is their marriage valid?

To say 'yes' would imply that no one has a valid marriage until the first child is born. As we remember from our catechetical training, there are two things necessary for a valid marriage. First, the vows are exchanged with the full intent of each person to fulfill them and the marriage is consummated. Unless one of the spouses brings children to the marriage, all marriages begin without children but they are still valid.

Until they do conceive, each couple has no idea if God has the gift of children intended for their married life or not. There could be medical reasons for them to fail to have children. That would not invalidate the sanctity of their marriage vows.

There is one sense where the answer would be 'yes'. If a couple never has children because they never intended to be open to children, their marriage would be invalid. The invalidity would not come from the lack of children but because they did not meet the requirements for a sacramental marriage.

Marriage has two aspects; the unitive and the procreative. The unitive stems from Genesis 2:24 ("the two of them become one body"). The procreative is based on Genesis 1:28 ("be fertile and multiply"). In the sacrament of matrimony, the couple join themselves with the priest or deacon acting as the Church's chief witness. They join themselves through their consent to the promises asked of them in the marriage rite. This consent must include these two aspects for the marriage to be valid. Without this full consent, including openness to children, the consent is imperfect and no sacramental marriage results.

One further point, while large families are a great blessing from God, a large family is not necessary for a valid marriage either. Being open to the gift of life also means being responsible with this gift. The Church recognizes there may be grave reasons to postpone or avoid pregnancy. She approves of those methods to avoid pregnancy which respect the natural cycle of a couple's fertility. Never is it licit to use contraception as a means to avoid pregnancy and such use is a grave evil and never morally right.

INSURANCE AGENT'S MESSAGE

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things.

Take the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies. If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it could very well be that the beneficiary originally designated to receive the proceeds from that policy needs to be updated. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since been married, that could be updated to reflect your spouse, and even your children.

Most people list a primary beneficiary – that person is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary – an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

I routinely call all of our policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy – the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.
