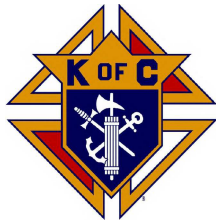

DEACON'S QUESTION BOX

Does the Devil really exist?

Absolutely! While there are many that would say no, they are doing that from the influence of the Devil himself. Those who deny his existence are not speaking from the mind of the Church. The Fourth Lateran Council (1215) defined that "the devil and the other evil spirits were created good in nature, but they became evil by their own actions." And unlike humans, their choice cannot be rescinded; it is permanent.

At baptism, adults are asked to renounce Satan and all his empty promises. We also do that every time we renew our baptismal vows. Holy Mother Church even has an official rite of exorcism. That would not be necessary if demons did not exist.

Jesus certainly knew demons exist and experienced them. We can find reports of these in Scripture; Matthew 4:1-11, Matthew 12:22-30, Mark 1:34, Luke 10:18, Luke 22:31, and John 8:44.

The Fathers of the Church also believed in demons. From them we know that the devil is an apostate angel who tries to darken hearts (Irenaeus) and whose main business is to corrupt mankind (Tertullian).

We also know they are put to flight through the use of the Cross says Athanasius. This probably refers to the use of the cross by an exorcist to cast out demons. Exorcists deal with obsession and possession. A case of possession, the demon controls a person's bodily actions. In obsession, the person is not controlled but the physical surroundings about the person are.

These may be disturbing but the most usual and dangerous work of demons is

focused on tempting us to apostasy and sin. Timothy warns us, "Some will turn away from the faith by paying attention to deceitful spirits and demonic instructions" (1 Timothy 4:1). While outright devil worship remains a relative uncommon thing, the spread seems to increase largely because of the slow and imperceptible slide into a life of sin through the temptations of the devil.
