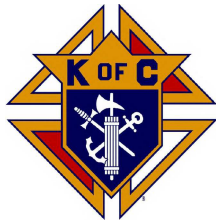

### DEACON'S QUESTION BOX

#### *What is the Difference between a Church and a Cathedral*

I could start this month as I did last month. That is, one can say that a Cathedral is a Church but a Church is not normally a Cathedral. That is because there are relatively few cathedrals compared to parish churches.

From the Greek and Latin *cathedra* (chair), a cathedral is so called for the chair of the bishop who has jurisdiction over the diocese of which the cathedral is the central church and the bishop's official church. Ordinarily, the cathedral is the site of the principal liturgical activities of the bishop

and his diocese. Here the bishop is consecrated and enthroned upon his *cathedra*, an ancient symbol of someone's teaching authority. In his cathedral, the bishop ordains, confirms, blesses the sacred oils on Holy Thursday, celebrates the liturgy of the Sacred Triduum, and presides at Pontifical Masses. Often bishops are interred in a cathedral crypt.

The cathedral must be located in the diocese, usually in the see city in which the bishop exercises his authority. Properly, only a cathedral named for the patron of the diocese can be called a cathedral; otherwise, it is termed a pro-cathedral.

Although St. Peter's Basilica is commonly identified with the Pope as Bishop of Rome, it is not his cathedral. The papal *cathedra* is at St. John Lateran, the actual cathedral of Rome and mother church for all Catholic churches.

The first cathedral established in the United States is the Basilica of the Assumption. It was designated in 1790 as the cathedral of the primatial see of Baltimore. It is a masterpiece of the neo-Classic style and was designed by Latrobe who was also the architect of the U.S. Capitol. Other historic cathedrals in the United States include St. Patrick's Cathedral, New York; St. Matthew's Cathedral, Washington, the site of President John F. Kennedy's requiem Mass; and the Basilica-Cathedral of Saints Peter and Paul, Philadelphia, completed by St. John Neumann, bishop of Philadelphia.
