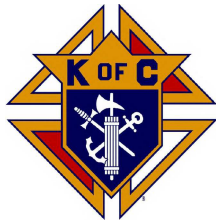

DEACON'S QUESTION BOX

Does Reason Have A Role To Play In Our Salvation Or Do We Just Merely Have To Believe?

A few months ago I addressed the question 'can we earn salvation by good works alone'. You may remember that I said that belief in our ability to achieve salvation totally through our own actions is a heresy called 'Pelagianism' and that the salvation comes about by means of faith in Christ, and in a life of good works lived in response to God's invitation to believe. Since we know faith is a free gift of God, it raises the question of the role of reason in our salvation.

It is true that we cannot reason our way into faith. But it is also true that we need reason to overcome all the stumbling blocks placed in the way of our accepting the gift of faith. Reason can help us see that Christianity, particularly Catholic Christianity, is reasonable and it 'hangs together'. This is not faith itself but a necessary prelude to faith.

The Catholic Church takes a higher ground than Pelagius (we can do it ourselves) and Calvin (everything we do is worthless). The Church teaches that knowledge of God and the moral law can be found through natural reason. Reason would not be able to apprehend the most important truths that are reserved for Revelation such as the nature of the Trinity. But through reason's awareness of God and moral law, we can begin a natural preparation of the intellect, getting it ready to let the will respond in the proper manner to grace. Through reason, we can get rid of the distractions and the misinformation that keeps us from acting on grace which leads to faith.

It follows then that continuing to use our reason after we have accepted faith is important to our spiritual development. It is

through study and reason that we deepen our knowledge of revelation. Deepening knowledge leads to an ever deeper love of the faith and of the Church. I know this from my own experience.

When I came into the Church, there were many things the Church taught that were strange to me. I did not agree with some of the things the Church taught. But, I was determined that I would assent to those teachings and then try to understand them. It was through study, reason, and prayer that I came to see the wisdom and truth in those teachings.

INSURANCE AGENT'S MESSAGE

We all know the old adage – the grass seems greener on the other side of the fence. When it comes to replacing your existing Knights of Columbus life insurance with coverage offered by another company, the adage holds true. Perceptions are deceiving. A move to *the other side of the fence* might seem like a good one, but it can leave you with less *green* in your wallet – in some cases, a lot less. That's why it pays to remember another old saying – *Read the fine print.*

There are many reasons to keep your existing coverage in force, whether that coverage is with the Knights of Columbus or with another company. I'll focus potential pitfalls of replacing coverage here – pitfalls that an agent trying to convince you that grass actually is greener might neglect to mention.

First, all life insurance contracts contain a *contestability period*, which allows the insurer to contest claims made for a period, typically two years, after the contract is issued. Chances are this is no longer an issue with your current coverage.

Second, it's unlikely that you can obtain the same amount of coverage, for the same premium, that you were able to obtain with your existing contract. The two factors that determine how much you'll need to pay for life insurance coverage are age and health. Certainly, you're older now than you were when you took out your current coverage. There's no way around that one. And you have to ask yourself, has your health changed during that time? Is your blood pressure the same? Your cholesterol? Have you gained weight? All these factors

affect the amount of coverage you'll get for your premium dollar.

If someone encourages you to replace your existing coverage, please call me. I'll show you how your existing coverage is working for you and why replacement is not in your best interest.

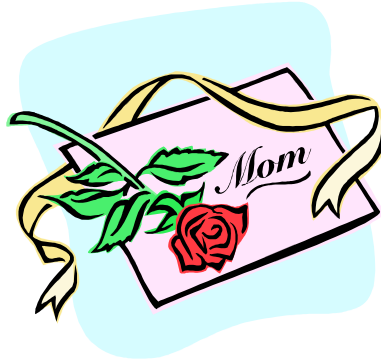
